

The Kencho is Okinawa Prefecture's governmental and economic center. The location is characterized by its many shopping streets in areas such as Kokusai Street. The Naha Great Tug-of-War is held at the Kumoji intersection and Route 58.

Kokusai Street c-6


3 minute walk from Kencho-mae Station, 5 minute walk from Miebashi Station, immediate access from Makishi Station,


Kokusai Street is the most representative street in Okinawa, where you can enjoy both shopping and gourmet foods, day and night.

Kokusai Street stretches for 1.6km, from the Palette Kumoji intersection to the Asato intersection. You can enjoy many kinds of shopping day and night in department stores, shopping malls, gift shops and restaurants. Also, on Sundays, the street which is usually frequented by cars is transformed into a pedestrian only zone called the "Transit Mall", which was established with the theme "A kinder city, a fun walking city" in mind. There are 5 performance areas on the street where you can watch bands and street performers for free.

Kencho-mae Station Area

Surrounding areas of Kencho-mae Station is a business district, home to various banks and major enterprises. It offers convenient access for shopping and is close to Kokusai Street. The area is a popular area to enjoy the nightlife too, so when going out for drinks, the monorail is a safe and convenient mode of transportation. The Kumoji Intersection nearby is where the Great Naha Tug-of-War takes place every October, with the giant rope recorded in the Guinness Book of World Records

Miebashi Station Area

Miebashi Station is located at the intersection of Okiedori Street and the Kumoii River. On the Yui Rail running along Kumoji River to the other side of the Asato River, riders can enjoy a view of the highgrowth districts along the river.

Sending forth Okinawa's traditional culture

"Tenbusu" in the Okinawan dialect means "navel". As the name suggests, the complex is located in the center of Kokusai Street.

The theater offers Okinawan traditional performing arts of main island as well as from adjacent islands. The second floor houses the Naha Traditional Museum of Arts and Crafts where visitors can make their own bingata-dyes.

Bringing traditional Okinawan arts and crafts together in one facility. Various items are for sale, with special exhibition rooms featuring standing exhibits of lacquer ware and displays of various creations. Visitors are welcome to experience bingata-dyes and Ryukyu glass wares.





Heiwa Street - Tsuboya Area

This area has become prosperous as a sightseeing center for the Kosetsu Ichba public market and Tsubova. Visitors can come across the energetic working people in the public market area. In Tsubova, shops selling Tsubova-vaki pottery and ceramic studios line the streets. There are even studios that will allow visitors to try their hands at pottery. Passing through Heiwa Street brings one to both the public markets and Tsuboya, making for an enjoyable and efficient tourist experience

Clothing stores and variety shops line this street. This is the arcade area of the Okinawa Mitsukoshi Department Store, Hawaiian style shirts and other everyday items are sold here and it is bustling with visitors and tourists. The Peace Love Machigwa Festival is held here in July.

Meat, fish, pickled and dried foods all line up in Okinawa's kitchen. The second floor boasts of a prolific array of food stalls. Visitors can even have fish bought fresh in the market downstairs to be prepared immediately. (Extra costs are required for preparations.)

This museum is a great place to get acquainted with Tsuboya before you begin your stroll in the area.

The museum disseminates information related to the pottery of Tsuboya. In addition to a chronological

introduction to Okinawan ceramics, there is a preserved kiln exhibition and design exhibition room. The history of Tsuboya District can be seen at the theater corner (18 minute film).

The works of 24 studios are exhibited and sold here The hall was created as a cooperative sale and exhibit area to promote the sale of Tsuboya pottery. The work of 24 kilns from Naha, Yomitan, and Onna Village are gathered here in one location. There is a corner featuring the work of Japanese National Treasury Jiro Kinjo as well.
