




Concentrated around Shurijo Castle there are many important cultural properties, places of interest, ancient sites and places of prayer that dot the neighborhood. Heading out from the station for a stroll is highly recommended.

Shurijo Castle Park F-6

15 minute walk from Shuri Station; 5 minutes via 150 yen bus 098-886-2020 (Shurijo Castle Park Management Center) 1-2 Kinjo-cho Shuri Naha City From April to June and October to November: 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM (entry until 6:30 PM); From July to September: 8:30 AM to 8:00 PM (entry until 7:30 PM); From December to March: 8:30 AM to 6:00 PM (entry until 5:30 PM) *Ticket sales available up to 30 minutes before closing.

> This World Heritage symbolizes the Ryukyu Kingdom. It is illuminated from sunset to midnight every day, creating an attractive and mystical atmosphere.









Tamaudun was built in 1501 by King Sho Shin as the royal tombs for the kings of the Second Sho Dynasty, lit consists of 3 gabled tombs constructed of stone. E-5 Consists of a gloder units Constitute of state. 2

The headquarters of the Rinzai Buddhist sect in the Ryukyu Kingdom. King Sho Shin commanded its construc-tion in commemoration of his father, King Sho En in 1492. If took 3 years to complete. It uses architectural techniques from both Japan and China. It was rebuilt in 1958 after having been destroyed during the Battle of Okinawa.
