Exploring Shuri starts here. If you don't feel like walking, you may opt to take the 150 yen bus to the next point, the Shureimon Gate.





Shureimon Gate

An entrance to Shurijo Castle, with Chinese architectural features. It has become a symbolic structure for Okinawa, as it became a design printed on the 2,000 ven notes.



After a relaxing stroll along the paved-road, take advantage of the distilleries open to the public and learn more about awamori, Okinawa's distilled liquor. In the area Zuisen and Mizuho distilleries offer tour opportunities for visitors.





Shurijo Castle

World Heritage Site. You can take your time to closely examine the gates and other structural features, or take advantage of the many photo-op stops. The Shurijo Castle offers in-depth look into the culture of Ryukyu and the bygone kingdom.

Kanagushiku Mura-ya

A perfect spot to enjoy a break. Located along the hill of the stone-paved road, visitors are welcome to rest and enjoy the atmosphere at no cost.





Stone Pavement of Kinjo-cho

The charm of this course awaits you at the stone-paved road just 300 meters past the Shurijo Castle, to the south.

Big Akagi Trees of Kinjo-Cho

Left from the stone-payed road is the Uchi-Kanagusuku Utaki, a sacred place where the traditional event of Muchi is said to originate. Within the grounds of this sacred site are large Akagi (bishop wood) trees.

Makishi Station is conveniently located to enjoy shopping along Kokusai Street, and is also a perfect location to start exploring the arcade of Heiwa Street and Yachimun Street which Naha OPA offers various pottery items.



Surrounding Areas of the Kosetsu Ichiba (Public Market)

A stroll through Heiwa Street will lead you to this area. The public market is a great area to explore, with a maze of alleys offering everything from bento boxed meals and other prepared foods along the so-called Sozai-dori street, and clothing and apparels at Mutsumi Street. There are numerous alleys like Ebisu Street and Ukishima Street, as well as Shintenchi Ichiba that specializes in clothing, and the Noren Ichiba, a produce market.



Tsuboya Yachimun Street. (Pottery Street)

The approximately 400-meter street is lined with shops selling Tsuboya pottery ware. There are potter-direct retails stores as well, and visitors can experience creating their own Tsuboya pottery goods.



Ishimachi Street

A narrow alley located on the north-side of Yachimun Street. The stone walls covered with ivy have been here for 300 years.
